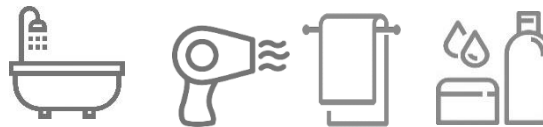

Plugs

■ F plug

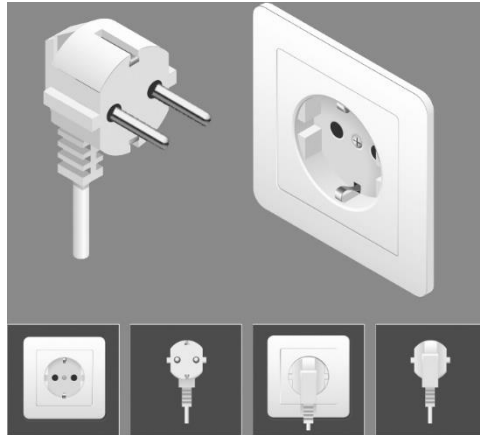
This electrical socket is common in: Germany, Austria, Netherlands, Luxembourg, Spain, Holland, Iceland, Greece and in many countries in Europe.

The Type F plug has two round pins.

It is similar to a Type E plug; however, instead of a hole for the earth pin, it has two earth clips on the sides.

A plug is designed to fit both Type E and Type F sockets.

It has earth clips on its sides to work with Type F sockets as well as a hole for the earth pin of Type E sockets.



■ C plug

Type C (electrical socket/electrical plug)

This electrical socket is common in: Europe except for GB, Ireland, Cyprus and Malta

European universal electrical plug type C

The Type C plug (also called the Europlug) has two round pins. The plug fits any socket that conforms to these dimensions. It also fits into Type E, F, J, K or N sockets that often replace the Type C socket.

Type C plugs are generally limited to a maximum of 2.5 A.
